#### **RISK CONTROL MEASURES** Identify which control measures you will apply to alleviate the relevant risks **SUPERVISION** Discussion around staying within sight of the Educator at all times Educator to be actively supervising and engaged in the activities with children Educator to be responsible for the children at all times, no other adults to be left alone with children Educator will position themselves to be able to view all children VISITORS Discussing stranger danger with children Children to be actively supervised at all times by the Educator Other adults attending the FDC environment are not to be left alone with children Discussion around aggressive or inappropriate persons in the environment Visitor log to be completed for all visitors on every visit Provide visitors with guidelines or a short orientation about the facility's safety protocols, emergency procedures, and behaviour expectations during their visit. □ Regular visitors to the home to hold a valid blue card □ Ensure that visitors are aware of emergency procedures, including evacuation routes and meeting points, in case of emergencies KDFC POLICIES, PROCEDURES AND REFERENCE MATERIALS Educator to have read and understand all policies and procedures Educator complies with all policies and procedures **BEHAVIOUR OF CHILDREN** □ Children to follow directions given by the Educator □ Children to stay within sight of the Educator at all times □ Regular discussion with children about behaviour expectations
